How to Get Around

Having your own car is best to see everything and get to all the scenic views.

• Rent a Car: If you fly into Oregon (like Portland Airport - PDX), you need to rent a car. This lets you go at your own speed and find secret viewpoints and hiking starts.

- Pretty Highway 101: This famous road goes along the whole Oregon Coast. It has amazing views. Plan to stop often at viewpoints and state parks. Be careful, some parts can be winding, and fog can make it hard to see.
- Coast Roads: Make your trip better by driving on special scenic roads. Like the Three Capes Scenic Loop near Tillamook. These roads give you closer views of the coast and lead to cute small towns.

- Tides and Rip Currents: Always check the tide times before going to beaches, tide pools, or sea caves. The water coming in can quickly trap you. Watch out for rip currents, which are strong water flows going out to sea. If you get caught, swim sideways to the shore until you are out of the pull, then swim to shore.
- Cliff Safety: Stay on marked paths and keep far from the edge of cliffs. The land is always changing, and cliffs can be shaky. Don't climb on shaky rocks or old wood.
- Ready for Weather: The coast weather can change fast. Always bring extra clothes, like a waterproof and windproof jacket. You can get cold fast if you get wet.
- Watch Animals: Look at animals from a safe distance. Don't go near them or feed them. Be extra careful around sea animals like seals and sea lions.
