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# Pack once, pack right

*Coast weather swings by the hour — this list makes sure the weather never wins.*

The Oregon Coast rewards people who layer. Pack the all-season base kit below, add the season-specific pieces, and you'll be comfortable through fog, sun, wind, and the odd passing shower — all in the same afternoon. Print it and check as you go.

## HOW TO USE THIS LIST

Start with the **base kit** (every trip, every season), then jump to your season's add-ons. The one rule that never changes: **bring layers and a rain shell.**

# The all-season base kit

*Pack these every trip, no matter the month.*

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## Wear & layers

- **Rain jacket** — a waterproof, packable rain jacket. The MVP of the coast.
- **Warm fleece** — a warm fleece or two; even summer evenings are cool.
- **Good shoes** — comfortable, closeable walking shoes plus water shoes/sandals.
- **Layerable tops** — tees and long sleeves you can add and shed all day.

## Don't-forget extras

- **Sun protection** — sunscreen and sunglasses; the glare off water and sand burns even on grey days.
- **Water & daypack** — a reusable water bottle and a small daypack.
- **Basics** — chargers, any medications, and a little cash for small-town stops.

# Add by season

*Start from the base kit, then add these.*

**JUN–SEP**

### Summer

Swimsuit, sun hat, and a [pop-up windbreak](#) for breezy beaches. Mornings are foggy — keep the fleece handy.

**SEP–OCT**

### Early fall

The warmest, clearest season — light layers plus a shell. Little else needed. The sweet spot.

**NOV–MAR**

### Winter

Serious rain gear, [hat & gloves](#), waterproof boots, and warm socks. Perfect for storm-watching.

**MAR–MAY**

### Spring

Everything-at-once weather — layer relentlessly, and pack an extra dry top for showers.

#### THE LAYERING RULE

Base layer + fleece + waterproof shell, in every season. Add or shed as the day shifts — and on the coast, it always does.

# Beach-day & road-trip extras

*The little things that make coast days better.*

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## Beach day

- **Beach blanket** — a sand-free beach blanket or mat.
- **Windbreak** — a windbreak or pop-up shelter; the breeze is constant.
- **Binoculars** — binoculars for whales, seals, and puffins.
- **Tide app** — free, and essential for tide pools and safety.

## Road trip

- **A cooler** — a cooler for crab, cheese, and picnic stops.
- **Snacks, playlists & a paper map** — signal drops on remote stretches of 101.
- **Reusable bags & a towel** — for wet gear and impromptu finds.
